## DUE DILIGENCE FOR EARNED INCOME CREDIT:

The IRS is stepping up its efforts to verify Earned Income Tax Credit claims and is holding tax preparers responsible for exercising "DUE DILIGENCE" in preparing such returns. Failure to make sufficient inquiries <u>subjects a tax preparer to a \$ 500 fine</u>. Therefore, I will need the following information if you expect to claim an earned income credit.

Did the child/children live with you more than ½ year?
Could anyone other than yourself claim the child/children as a dependent?
What School did the child attend?
Do you have school records as evidence of the child's attendance?
